Lautner was idolized by young modernists, criticized by academics, and beloved by the clients who worked side by side with him to build their houses. It was a life in pursuit of beauty.

The overall unit is incredibly efficient and the 1,600SF space only consumes 1,000 kilowatts of electricity a month, much lower than the national average.
