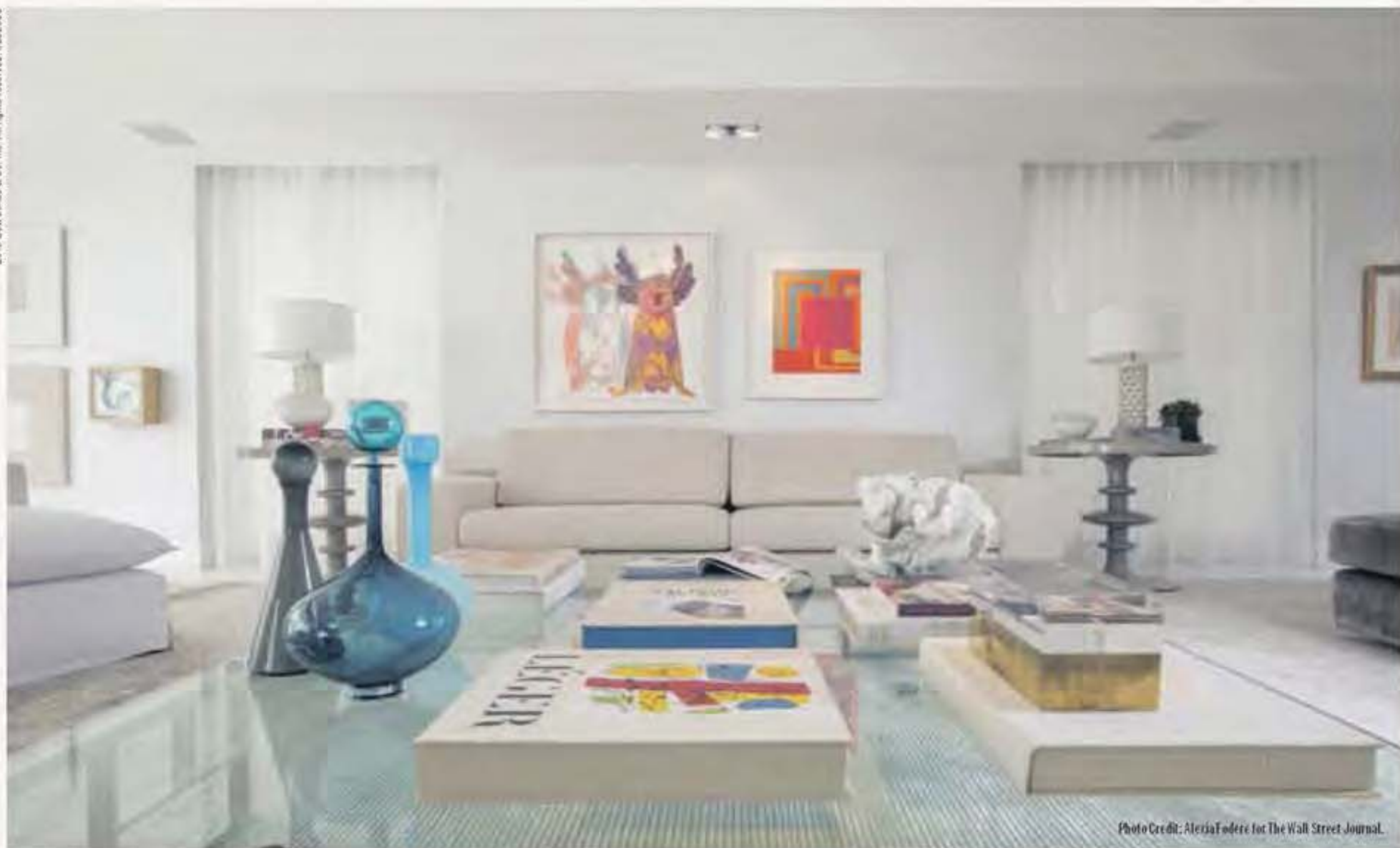

Sarah Broughton, an Aspen-based architect, says she thinks about designing homes for clients with major collections similarly to designing a museum or gallery space. The process can begin with an extensive inventory of the art to be displayed or rotated through the home. Roofless foam-core models with miniature versions of the artwork and lighting are then laid out in advance.
