

LIMELIGHT HOTEL KETCHUM OPENS DOORS

After working to get a hotel built at Main and First streets since 2010, Ketchum officially welcomed Aspen Skiing Company's Limelight Hotel at a grand opening celebration in January. The 175,000-square-foot hotel features 111 guest rooms and suites, 14 private residences, and 4,000 square feet of indoor function space. Rowland+Broughton Architecture / Urban Design / Interior Design based in Aspen, Colorado, created an interior design look that positions the property as a base camp. For example, a large, centrally located seating area focuses on a monolithic stone fireplace hearth. dubbed the "campfire" and has an overhead design installation utilizing fiber optics and lighting that replicates walking through a forest and emerging below a starry night sky. Throughout the hotel. color palettes are inspired by colors and textures of the natural environmental with primary materials including white oak, reclaimed barn wood, blackened steel and natural stone. limelighthotels.com/ketchum; rowlandbroughton.com

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS INTRODUCES **NEW ACTIVITIES**

➤ Live-action escape rooms are a new form of interactive entertainment, and Steamboat Springs has welcomed the addition of The Crooked Key. Teams use their communication skills and follow the clues to crack the puzzle and escape from one of two themed rooms in 60 minutes or less. The rooms accommodate groups of eight comfortably.

➤ Maverick Mini Golf, an 18-hole miniature golf course debuted this summer near the base of the Christie Peak Express and Preview chairlifts. The course design incorporate local landmarks, such as the iconic Steamboat Barn, Fish Creek Falls, Nordic ski jumps and Rabbit Ears.

➤ Outlaw Mountain Coaster, expected to operate yearround, is located near Christie Peak Express lift and rises between 4 and 40 feet above the ground with dips, waves, turns and 360-degree circles. Individuals ride the sled and then slide down the rails with the ability to control the sled's speed through a braking system.



Private Retreat Option for Hyatt Regency Tamaya

Groups can get the keys to the castle for an exclusive retreat at Hyatt Regency Tamava Resort & Spa, located on 500 acres of the Pueblo of Santa Ana between Santa Fe and Albuquerque. Only 200 of the 350 available rooms are required for a buyout from November through January; 250 rooms in February and March; and 300 rooms between April and October. A nearly 2-mile private road leads to the resort entrance for true seclusion, and there is a wide variety of activities on site such as Native American cultural activities led by members of the Santa Ana Pueblo; equestrian options ranging from group rodeos and horseback rides to volunteer opportunities with the Tamaya

Horse Rehabilitation Program; golf at the Twin Warriors Golf Club; and extreme relaxation at Tamaya Mist Spa & Salon. There are 29,000 square feet of indoor and 25,000 square-feet of outdoor meeting space, some patio views of the Sandia Mountains. tamaya.regency.hyatt.com
