ASPEN, CO—September 23, 2014--Rowland+Broughton Architecture and Urban Design took home awards in two categories at the 4th Annual International Interior Design Association (IIDA) Rocky Mountain Chapter's BEST Awards, held on September 12 at Denver's Paramount Theater.

A 2014 IIDA MERIT Award in the residential "Live" category was presented for Black Birch Modern Custom House and a 2014 IIDA BEST Award in the hospitality "Play" category was presented for Woody Creek Distillers. The awards celebrate 20 years of design.

Set in Aspen, Colorado, 6,400-square-foot Black Birch Modern is a modern adaptation of an existing traditional, log-style house with iconic gable forms. The floor plan was pushed and pulled to create a sense of compression and release while moving through the spaces. Gable ends are in-filled completely with glass, allowing natural light to filter through. The interiors complement the restraint and texture of the exterior materials and form. A mix of modern Italian furniture and fixtures is underscored by hand-made artisan furniture and natural materials. The R+B team included Laura Butler, IIDA, project manager Amanda Christianson, Sarah Broughton, AIA, John Rowland, AIA, and Ryan Hoffner, AIA.

Located in an industrial business center in Basalt, Colorado, Woody Creek Distillers encompasses a 10,700-square-foot, state-of-the-art distillery and barrel room, as well as an open tasting area, lounge, bar, retail space and private event space. Signature architectural details, including new clerestory windows overlooking 30-foot-high copper stills and rusted perforated exterior panels, reflect the nature of the Roaring Fork Valley. Interiors juxtapose natural beetle-kill pine with industrial lighting and burlap-inspired wall covering. The R+B team included Laura Butler, ASID, Sara Boulet Upton, AIA, Sarah Broughton, AIA, and John Rowland, AIA.

Woody Creek Distillers was also recognized by the Colorado Chapter of the American Society of Interior Designers with two 2014 ASID Crystal Awards: Judges' Merit for Best Overall Commercial and Under 20,000 Square Feet. Black Birch Modern will be featured as the cover story of the Fall 2014 Colorado edition of LUXE interiors + design, due out mid-October.
